## Thank you, Toledo!

- In 1961, the Sandusky Area Branch of Goodwill Industries of Toledo was formed with an outlet store on the northeast corner of West Market & Jackson Streets. David M. Davey was the branch's first manager.
- In 1964, the Sandusky Branch was expanded to include a sheltered workshop & Ladies Auxiliary. Clyde Carter was named Branch Manager.
- In 1965, Donald Lea was named Director of Sandusky Goodwill.
- In 1966, Donald Zeck was named Director of Sandusky Goodwill.
- In 1967, the Sandusky Area Branch opened a combination Department Store & Training Center at 419 W. Market Street in Downtown Sandusky.
- In 1969, Sandusky became a fully operational Division of Goodwill Industries of Toledo, with the responsibility for all local activity resting with the Advisory Board.

In January, the Bellevue Goodwill Shoppe was destroyed by fire. In May of the same year, the Bellevue Shoppe was relocated and reopened.

Mr. & Mrs. Elmer Spector donated a building at 138 E. Market Street to Goodwill. The Goodwill Retail Outlet known as 'The Peddler's Cart' was moved to this location.

The Norwalk Store relocated to the Wal-Mart Plaza. The Bellevue store was also relocated. The Vermilion Store was renovated. The Fremont Plant opened. The Sandusky Plant earned Goodwill International's 'Contract Operation of the Year' award.


Edison collected the most of all the schools, with 23,371 lbs of goods!

The Bellevue Plant produced 3,156,483 parts for Whirlpool Clyde, Berry Plastics, Envases, Borgers, Ventra, Logistiq, Precision Plastics and Revere Plastics in 2023.

Recycling

As part of our sustainability efforts in 2023, we recycled 103,778 lbs of used technology through our ongoing Dell Reconnect Partnership, repurposed **2,432 lbs** of polystyrene foam with our foam densifying machine, & salvaged 2,501,908 lbs of goods, diverting 71% of unsold goods from the landfill.
